



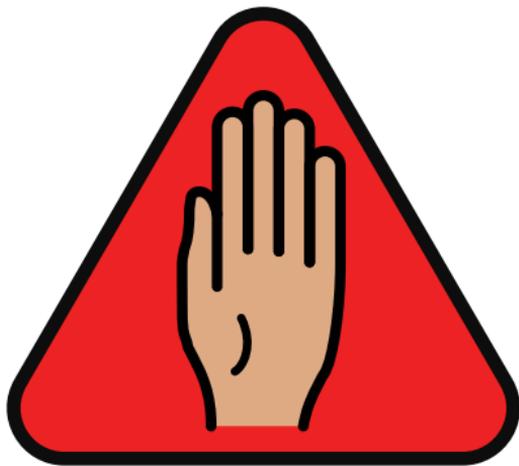
Travel Together Safely





This lanyard is a visual tool to help a young person with complex additional support needs learn road safety skills.

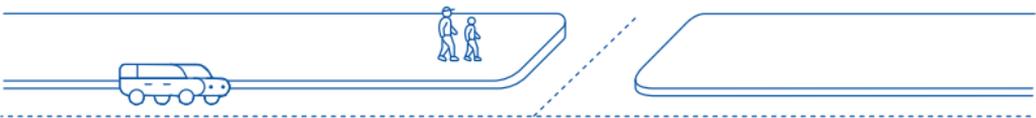
Use the cards in real-life situations to prompt them to 'Stop, Look, Listen, Think' when walking or wheeling in the community.

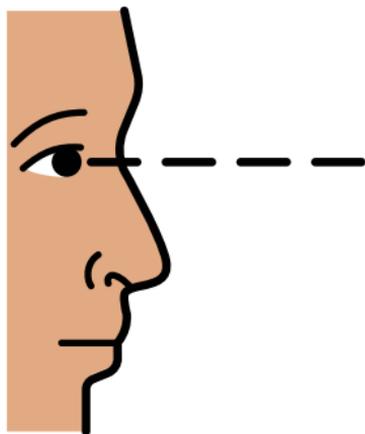


Stop

Stop

- Stop before crossing roads, driveways or car parks.
- Stay back from the edge of the pavement.
- Only cross where there's a clear, straight path ahead.
- Use crossings if available (e.g. zebra, pelican, or patrol).
- Avoid crossing between parked cars or near bends.
- Praise calm waiting.

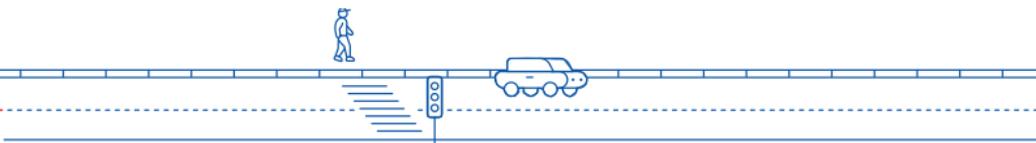


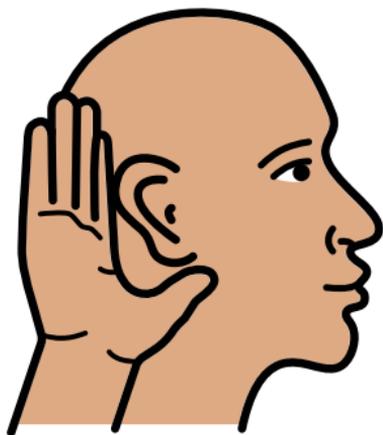


Look

Look

- Support the learner to look in all directions for traffic.
- Start by looking right, then left, then right again.
- Vehicles can appear suddenly, so keep looking while crossing.
- Look out for cyclists and motorbikes.
- Help the learner to focus if they become distracted.

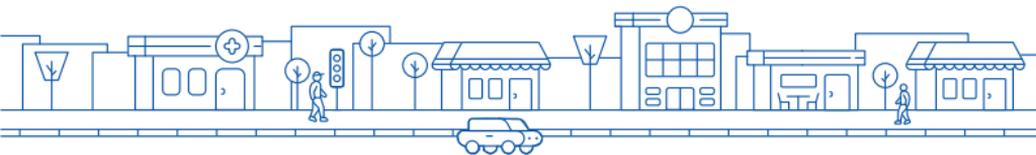


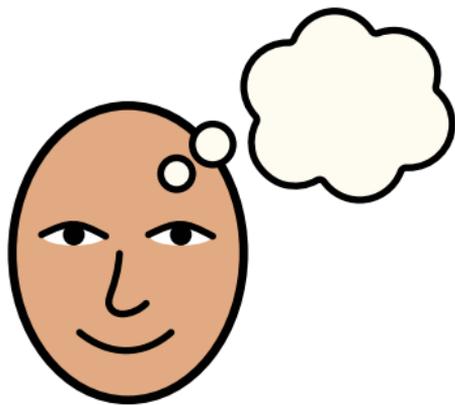


Listen

Listen

- Listen for traffic sounds. Most vehicles can be heard before they're seen.
- Remind the learner that some vehicles, like electric cars, are very quiet.
- Listening helps but make sure you always look too.
- Use your own hearing to support the learner if needed.

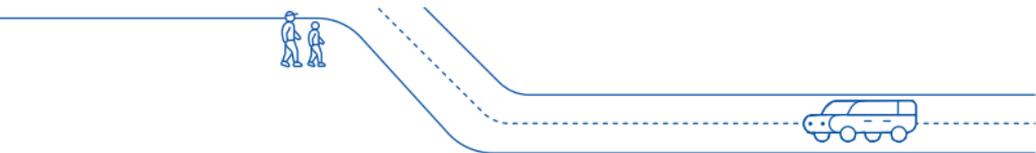




Think

Think

- Help the learner to notice what's happening around them.
- Is traffic coming? Wait, then look again.
- Are vehicles moving fast? Is there enough time to cross safely?
- Is there a safer place to cross nearby, like a zebra crossing?
- Remember: the learner may need extra time to cross.





Every journey you take together helps build road safety skills that could one day save the learner's life.
